Torah, Avodah, G'milut Chasadim....These are the pillars of Judaism.

Even in a pandemic, and in ANOTHER year of uncertainty, we never lose sight of these pillars and how we can help our community live through this lens. There are countless programs and opportunities at CNT, just look inside this bulletin and take your pick. I wanted to share with you just a few of the projects I am lucky enough to dream up, create, and simply be a part of...

<u>Torah</u>: Religious School happily reopened to record pre-registration numbers. It would not have been possible without our amazing new assistant principal, Hayley Wizig, and education committee VP, Deanna DeArkland and the committee supporting her. We are launching new and innovative programs like... chugim! A fun activity based learning at the end of each day, geared towards the special

interests of our students. We have also launched "Parent's Night Out" and brought back the experience of field trips. We are looking forward to a wonderful year deeply rooted in the study of Torah.

Avodah: The High Holy Days are this month, and this year, we give you: HYBRID High Holy Days. While I am over the moon to be able to be back in person for the chanting of Kol Nidre, we cannot ignore that these last eighteen months have brought us immense loss, hardships, and the need to rebuild ourselves and our sense of community. These are all reasons why Avodah (worship) should be easy, but if you are like me, when the going gets tough, it is tough to get going. Instead of focusing on the climb up to the diving board, I am choosing to focus on the water. With all of our heart, we are going to take a deep dive and plunge into the beautiful reality that is the Days of Awe. Join us as we turn inward, face our truths, and mend fences.

All of the main services can be live in person or streamed online. Yom Kippur Afternoon, Yizkor, and Healing Services, we invite you to enjoy the comfort of your home, and stream online only. We will close the gates of Yamim Noraim in person, outdoors under the setting sun followed by Havdallah. The greatest gift of joining us in person will be the sound of the choir and shofar. While all of this can be translated through the speakers of your TV, after last year's experience we learned, there is nothing like a live choir and shofar call. NOTHING. Our choir, both adult and teen, showed up with more beauty, determination, and resilience than ever, and they are going to WOW you.

G'milut Chasadim: Mitzvah projects are a key component in the framework of becoming b'nai mitzvah. Prayer, Torah, Haftarah, and D'var Torah are all important, but the mitzvah project is what truly begins to transform a child into an adult. Students are asked to pick a mitzvah that is special to them. When they are grappling with what they should do, I ask them, "When you look out into the world, what do you see that you wish you could change... Start there." This year, the pandemic shed a new light on the importance of doing acts of kindness. Between toy drives for kids with cancer, making masks for native American tribes without resources, buddying up to play sports with special needs kids, and so much more... These students have not only impressed us, they have inspired us all to do better.

This might just sound like a random recap of notable things, but it is not random. It is a glimpse of the work we do everyday to inspire, connect, nourish, and guide our community through the lens of *Torah*, *Avodah*, and *G'milut Chasadim*. There is so much more... In fact, there is something for everyone here at CNT. Need to connect? Need to do Jewish? Need to study? Need to grow? Just reach out, and we will be there for you.

Nevadans for the Common Good

Our CNT NCG Steering Committee has been on hiatus over the summer but via ZOOM had been previously participating in NCG Regional House Meetings. These Meetings focused on issues or concerns that folks have regarding unemployment, mental stress, the need for social connection, educators/the system being overwhelmed, children and potential isolation, families experiencing food insecurity and rental evictions/foreclosures. Consequently, NCG members have met with County Commissioner Kirkpatrick and Vice Chair Gibson-- and also in an additional Community Meeting sponsored by NCG-- to discuss some of the above concerns and to offer help in the area of folks navigating the Rental Assistance Program here in Southern Nevada.





We have also been participating in State Legislative Tracking with NCG committee members from CNT, Grace in the Desert Episcopal Church, Christ the King Catholic Community and St. Thomas More Catholic Community. Members of this committee have made recommendations and written comments on State Bills and Amendments to the Nevada State Legislature that are of great importance and influence to and for our community.

We are also proud of the accomplishments of our NCG Addiction & Recovery Group with its two Civic Academies that were held--- the last one having focused on the use and operation of NARCAN—a life saving device used on substance users who experience drug overdoses.

Presently, we are involved with NCG'S Postcard Mailing Project spearheaded by Ruth Urban here at Congregation Ner Tamid. This involves the American Rescue Plans Act (ARPA) funds that will be coming to Clark County to be used in an accessible way for eligible families and individuals. The postcards are being sent to the County to encourage the building of strong social service programs to assist our community. Our congregation committed itself to sending in 50 postcards to assist with this project.

Our next CNT NCG Steering Committee meeting will take place after the High Holy Days on Thursday September 23rd at 5:15pm. via ZOOM or in person-- to be determined. For further information, email Dorie Kirtman or Susie Sernoe, Co-Chairs.


